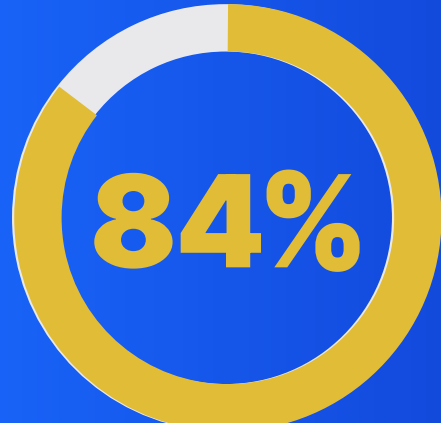

## What the Legal-IT relationship looks like

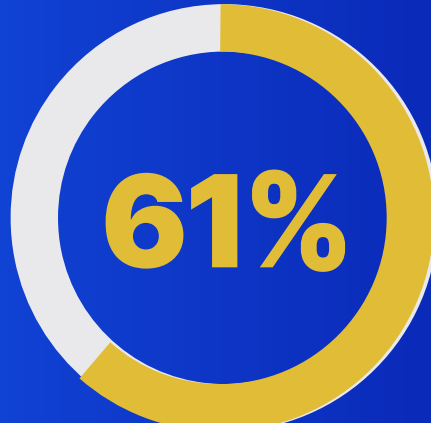
Survey respondents shared how their IT and legal teams partner on tech strategy and implementation. Here are some of the most common responses.

-  Automation of complex processes

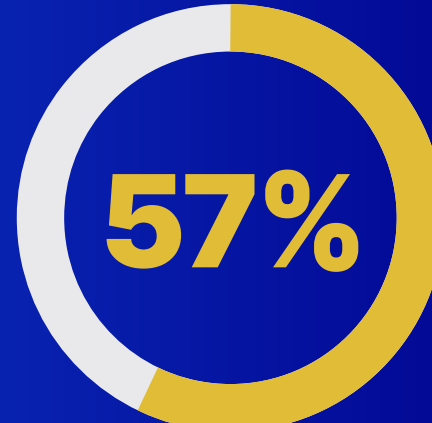

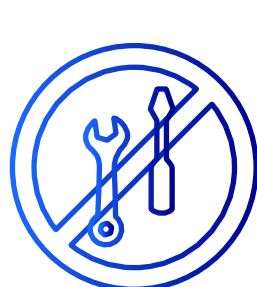
